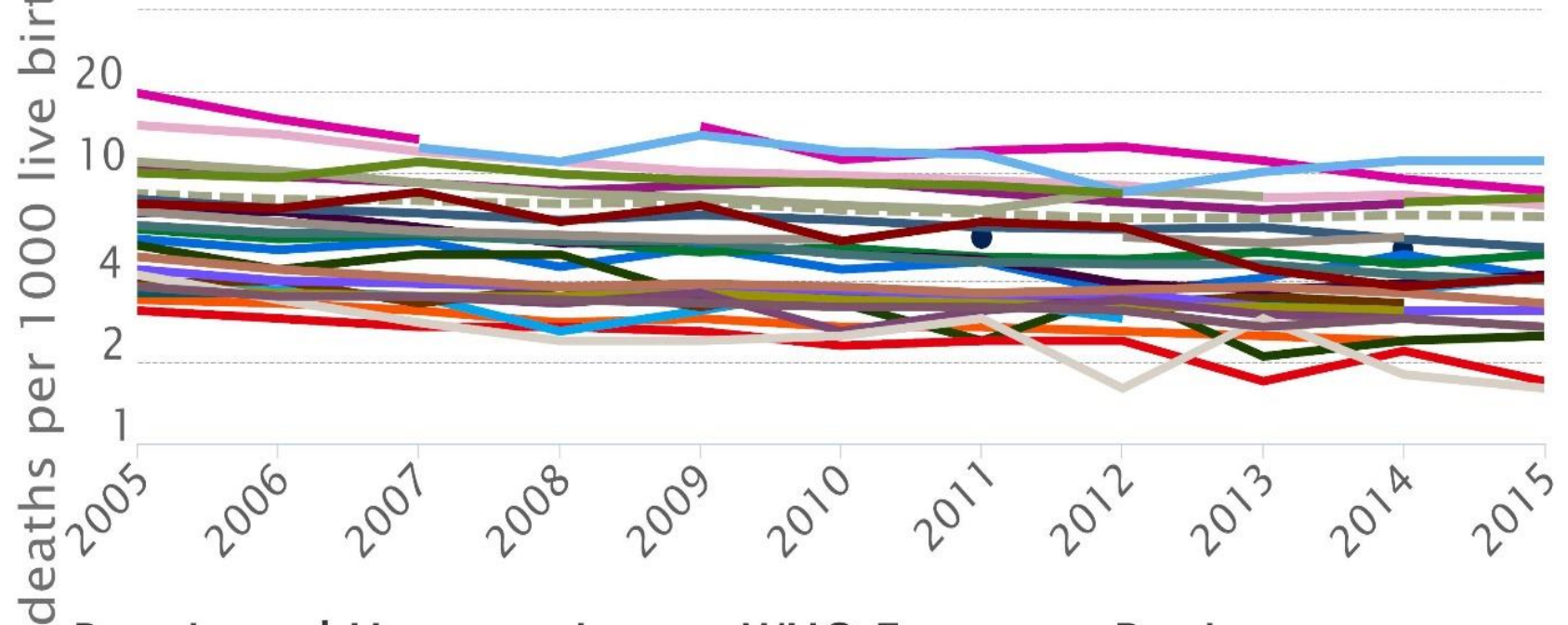

Previous activities of national societies

- Annual national conferences in perinatal care and mortality / morbidity and continuous professional development courses to share information and educate staff
- Collaboration with governmental institutions and other professional organizations in the field of perinatal medicine
- Regional and international collaboration
- Creation and implementation of national guidelines
- Participation in programs and health care boards as experts
- Organization and establishment of milk banks
- Collaboration with parent's supporting organizations

Challenges and goals

- Reduction of perinatal/neonatal mortality and morbidity:
 - Adaptation of international standards for the provision of perinatal care
 - Improvement of prenatal diagnosis
 - Introduction of screening programs
 - development of better regionalization of perinatal / neonatal care (in utero transfer, postnatal transfer)
 - Family centered care
- Preparation for electronic register of newborns and births
- Establishment of national registry of high risk infants
- Introduction of follow-up programs
- Support equipment and staffing of perinatal care centers
- Creation of breast milk banks
- Palliative care standards
- Reglementation of home births

Summary of all societies' expectations from UENPS:

- Better cooperation and sharing information throughout UENPS
 - Regional and wider
- Education in professional development by courses, using lecturers from all societies and UENPS experts
- Development of guidelines and algorithms
- Sharing and planning multicentric investigations
- Experts exchange – visiting of NICUs
- Promotion of standards of care of newborn infant
- Establishment of universal European curriculum and syllabus for training in neonatology

- Establishing Working groups of societies' representatives for
 - Scientific investigations
 - Education
 - Perinatal outcomes
 - Etc.
- Engagement of midwives and nurses societies to UENPS
